Amphilex 2002 is an International Stamp Show and Exhibition which was held in Amsterdam from August 30 to September 3^{rd} . There were 1750 frames of exhibits, occupying a total floor capacity of 17,300 m² (c. 175,000 ft²). Trade booths with 3m (c.10ft) frontage cost €1,950 (c. \$3000). They were expecting 75.000 visitors — and got them.




