On the Cover...



The Lifesaving Society stamp was released on July 25th to coincide with National Drowning Prevention Week.

This handsome blue and white stamp was released by Canada Post this summer celebrating the 100th Anniversary of the Lifesaving Society. A female lifeguard stands proudly in the foreground with vignettes of male lifeguards in action displayed behind each of her shoulders. An intense royal blue image of water fades to white at the bottom of the background tying the three images together. The self adhesive 52c stamp is

available in booklets of ten.

Canadian Stamp News has reported a variety in the perforations of this stamp. As shown in the biweekly paper the pattern of perforations is a mirror image of that shown on the left. ie: the top left corner perf points up and the top right corner points out. I wonder if different booklets are available or if the variety is available as a single in the quarterly and yearly packs. Canada Post has been known to do that before. The Petro-Canada stamp released in September of 2000 had a reversed perforation pattern in the singles available only in the collector's packs. Canada Post is ever so creative when it comes to getting into your wallet.

This is how the Society describes themselves on their national web-site: "The Lifesaving Society, Canada's lifeguarding experts for the past 100 years, is a national, volunteer organization and registered charity whose mandate is drowning prevention. The Society's programs include: Learn to Swim, Lifesaving, Lifesaving Sport, Water Smart®, Public Education, Research, First Aid and Boating. The Lifesaving Society remains the leader in lifeguard training, and in 2008 will provide training and certification to over 500,000 nationally."

Along with teaching swimming and training young people as lifeguards youth can participate competitively. The society holds national and international lifesaving championships. The 2003 international games were held in Toronto. This year's games were held in Germany in August.

The Lifesaving Society has used their research to compile a series of basic water safety tips as well as lists of tips for safety in different water situations.
