At our May meeting **Ken Magee** came to talk to us about constructing a stamp exhibit. Ken began his discussion talking about design layout and other graphic elements. He went on to discuss the rules of exhibiting, methods of mounting, judging and the point system that the judges use. Mr. Magee brought a number of his own pages as examples, as well as some published material. He also came with copies of a four page handout called 'Getting Started in Exhibiting' and appropriately; a single page about one page competitions. A copy of these leaflets

## Cover...Marine Life



Although printed in Sweden this souvenir sheet has the now familiar

On May 13th Canada Post released a charming pair of marine animals as a joint issue with Sweden. The harbour porpoise and the sea otter can be found off the coasts of both countries. Details magazine does not give us any hints as to the timing of or reason for the joint issue other than to say that Sweden is a world leader in stamp engraving. The engraver, Lars Sjööblom worked from photographs of the animals taken by Bill Curtsinger. (Part of the National Geographic Image Collection.) Lars

Sjööblom works full time as an engraver. One of his favourites of his own works is a lovely depiction of the mountain angelica plant. That engraving evolved from his



own life drawings of the plant.

The stamps were designed by Martin Mörck who has been a freelance stamp designer since 1978. Mr. Mörck tied the animal engravings together with bold blue and turquoise waves of colour and bubbles. Some of the background colour has been allowed to show through

the engravings. The waves on the stamps, the background of the souvenir sheets and on the OFDCs are reminiscent of the 'Sea to Sky' stamps of the Vancouver 2010 Winter Olympics.



While Canada's OFDC has the fun and funky waves right across the whole cover, Sweden's OFDCs tend to be more reserved with a vignette on the left hand side that pertains to the given subject. In the case of the Marine animals issue it is the depiction of a sea otter afloat on its back.

Sweden's Marine Life issue is made up of four stamps. Their issue also includes the blue whale and the ringed seal. Perhaps Canada Post decided to keep the Canadian issues down to two stamps because they will be releasing a ten dollar definitive stamp featuring the blue whale in August.

May 13 was a very busy day for Sweden Post. Along with the marine animal issue, three other stamp issues were released that day including a stamp celebrating the upcoming marriage of Crown Princess Victoria and Daniel Westling in Stockholm Cathedral on June 19.

The Canadian stamps are available in a souvenir sheet of two and a booklet of

The new 'elliptical perforations look more like eight. The souvenir sheet has a maple leaf perforation between the stamps and what Canada Post is calling 'elliptical' perforations at both ends. These are not at all like the elliptical perforations found on Great Britain's Machin stamps. The booklet is unusual in that it is the

first gummed booklet that Canada Post has released since 2004. An Official First Day Cover can be purchased with just the two Canadian stamps or as a joint issue cover that includes the Swedish harbour porpoise and sea otter stamps. The Canadian cancellation is from Victoria B.C. where you might just spot these animals and Swedish cancel is from Stockholm.
