That is something he hasn't tried yet, so I said I would mention some sites. Naturally you may have some fears about purchasing things over the internet. I went out and got another credit card and set it up with a low limit. If some were to go on a spree on-line the credit card company would be onto it pretty darn quickly. I only use this card on-line so there are no mix ups. Next I signed up with Paypal. The handy thing about Paypal is that it sends funds in whatever currency the seller is asking for. Paypal converts the currency and my credit card is charged in Canadian funds. There might be a small conversion fee tangled in there somewhere but if so it isn't much. Generally it is the sellers who are paying the transaction fees. I found Paypal through a stamp site called Stamp Wants.com. It is an American based site now called BidStart.com and was just taken over by the Stanley Gibbons company. This is a large site where there are many stamp sellers. You must join the site to make purchases. Here you can find regularly going auctions or stores of various sellers. You can comparison shop or search for hard to find things. Once again Paypal is handy. I do not give my card number to any of the vendors and they are paid in American dollars or whatever they are asking for. Club members Rick Lokos and Rob Armstrong are sellers on BidStart.com.

Rob Armstrong also sells on Delcampe.net out of Belgium. It works the same way and many of the sellers accept Paypal too. The attitude is different though and some sellers ask you to pay the paypal fees. This is a much more

European site and you will encounter many more people of different languages. I have successfully made deals with people who don't speak English. I found it a little harder to get used to but it is working out.

Ebay is another option but I find it harder to navigate and find my areas of interest.

I hope that this can help people thinking about buying stamps on-line. But the web is just one way of finding stamps. It helps to support your local dealers too. Long time member John Cortan has a store in Ripley that also sells used books and jewellery and who knows what all!


I look forward to going through some of John Cortan's wares on Wednesday evening. If a few members showed up a little early I'm sure John could use some help bringing his boxes in.

On the Cover ... Year of the Snake



Our Canadian stamp year begins with the Year of the Snake stamps. As usual there is a pane of 25 perforated Permanent rate stamps and a long souvenir sheet bearing a perforated international rate stamp and the myriad of associated products. Both items are printed on a rich heavy

paper and are embossed but surprisingly only the souvenir sheet has gold foil details. The booklet of six international rate die cut stamps that folds down to credit card size does not have the gold foil either.

This year's snakes are associated with the water element. Wavy lines can be seen underlying the image of the large green snake and there are light concentric circles beneath the red domestic rate snake which is meant to

appear as slithering atop the water. Neither one of these images brought to mind water nor water snakes to me.

The green snake is displayed in a figure eight configuration which is a number the Chinese consider very lucky. If you are lucky perhaps you can

afford one of the three handsomely framed products available. There are only 800 enlarged prints of the green snake available. They are very striking and would definitely keep



my Mother-in-law away. I don't want to cause trouble though, so I best avoid the uncut press sheet too.

The New Chinese Lunar Year begins on February 10 this year. Happy New Year!


