CANADA'S FIRST ART STAMPS, by Bob Graham



Canada's first two stamps for which the major design element is based on a work of art are Scott # 138, the 1917 3¢ brown, and #142, the 1927 2¢ green. Both depict the noted portrait of the Fathers of Confederation, by Robert Harris.

Both stamps commemorate anniversaries of Confederation, the 50th and the 60th. In 1917 Canada was fully committed to winning World War I, and

there was little opportunity to celebrate the nation's fiftieth birthday. Ten years later, amid peace and prosperity, the sixtieth was celebrated in a style unsurpassed until our Centennial in 1967.

Robert Harris (1848-1919) Harris was commissioned to paint the Fathers of Confederation in 1883 and the finished work was installed in the Centre Block of the Parliament Buildings the following year. The agreed price for the work was \$4,000. Tragically, the painting was a casualty when the Centre Block burned in February 1916. It showed the delegates in session at the Charlottetown and Quebec Conferences of 1864.
