Zoom May 11th Meeting from Phil Visser

The far flung reaches of the Owen Sound Stamp Club spanned the continent. Attendees came for Alberta, New Brunswick, and Southern Ontario. Friendly chat and welcomes kept the spirits up until the presentations began. First up was a presentation done by Phil V. on a "Local" cover. A story will appear in a future newsletter about this cover.

Our intrepid world traveller returned in time to share the highlights of his trip. Apparently new shoes may be needed soon, but there were some philatelic highlights as well. Bill F made a trip to southern Spain and walked some hundred plus kilometers. There was also an obligatory drop in visit to Great Britain. While there, Bill scouted out some new King Charles definitives as well as showing a Coronation Day souvenir sheet.

Phil presented a second PowerPoint on Dutch stamps. This one showed an interesting "rabbit hole" in how a collection can become bigger. Shown were two Dutch stamps with cancellation on them. The cancellation is described as the "small round" cancel. This cancelling device was used for twenty plus years.

There are three elements to the cancellation. Looking at Figure 1 the top part of the cancel shows the post office location, on this stamp the place is Ter-Aar. In the middle of the cancellation is the date portion (17 Nov '91). At the bottom of the cancel is the time of day, 12-4 N (afternoon).





Knowing these elements, a collection can be easily expanded. Expansion arises due to the limited buying chances for the last few in a national collection. Branching out gets sometimes coined as "a rabbit hole." This has occurred and so a search is carried out to fill the holes in this aspect of the collection. A recent joy came about because the calendar collection was finally able to complete one month of the year

(see Figure 2 above). A search continues for the remaining thirty or so dates to complete a calendar year.

Marion G shared her experience at the Wasaga Beach gathering. Sales were made which covered the cost of the table. This is their first attempt at a show for many years and we look forward it reappearing next year. At around 8:45 the meeting was wrapped.
