On the Cover ... Robertson Davies

If you think that a picture is worth a thousand words, then perhaps that's why you became a stamp collector. When you look at this new stamp commemorating Robertson Davies' 100<sup>th</sup> birthday you might think "certainly Davies is a Canadian worthy of quite a few words – but the stamp seems so simple what does it have to say?"

There are actually a few points of interest about this new stamp. The rich tones of the black and white portrait of Davies with it's very dark background is the hallmark of Yousuf Karsh's photography. A greater portion of the shot can be seen on the booklet cover. We now have a number of stamps featuring the work of Yousuf Karsh. I have been unable to discover where and when this photo was taken. If you know please inform us.

The bright red '63' and 'Canada' is very dramatic against the black and gray tones of the photo. The red is likely used to represent our country's colours but did you realize that this is the first domestic rate stamp issued this year with a denomination? In the 'Details' magazine this stamp is shown with the permanent rate symbol not the numerals. I'll bet you that most Canadians don't even know what a stamp costs anymore. Of course the price keeps creeping up each year and the HST made the cost go up too: Having some permanent rate stamps hanging around for a while could make some people unaware of the rising costs. A single stamp adds up to 71 cents which now gets rounded down to 70 cents. You could save a whole dime if you bought your stamps individually but of course; most of them have to be purchased in booklets now, just like this issue.

The other point of interest on this stamp would not be recognized by anyone except an expert. The typeface used on this stamp (the name and date) is based on the 'Cartier' type face designed by Carl Dair. It is considered to be the first style of typeface to be Canadian and believe it or not that brings us back to the topic of Robertson Davies.



Robertson Davies greatest passion may have been for playwriting but he had much greater success at writing novels. After being educated at Upper Canada College, Queen's U. and Baliol College in Oxford, England, he did some acting in London. There he met his sweetheart Brenda Matthews, an Australian who was working as an assistant stage manager at the Royal Vic in London.

Upon his return to Canada in 1940 he became the editor of 'Saturday Night' magazine and a couple of years later became the

Editor of the Peterborough Examiner. He was Editor for fifteen years and then publisher for another ten. During this period he was able to write and publish a number of books, plays, articles and essays. He was involved with the local theatre group and also helped to found the the Stratford Shakespearian Festival.

Davies had a passion for Shakespeare and playwriting. He encouraged While still publishing the Peterborough paper Davies began teaching literature at Trinity College (part of U of T) in 1960. In 1963 he became the first master of the newly formed Massey College which was affiliated with the University of Toronto. You may notice that there is that number '63' again. It is intriguing to note that this year is also the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Massey

College. This college is not the Community College that many of us are familiar with – it is more like a college community. It is a residence for post graduate students, the best and brightest, who have been selected from a wide range of studies. The object of the College is to bring together some of the best minds from various fronts. Every year they produce the Massey Lectures series which may be familiar to CBC Radio listeners. It was funded primarily by Vincent Massey and the Massey Foundation.

Robertson Davies served as Master of Massey College until 1981. (Subsequent Masters have served seven year terms.) Davies founded what was known as the Lower Library in the college. Just as the college is unusual so is the Lower Library. The Upper Library is what you might expect in such a refined place of scholars with beautiful first edition books and volumes and volumes of weighty knowledge. The Lower Library

- since renamed as the Robertson Davies Library is more of a living, working museum of print and publishing. Here you will find information about printing techniques, typography, graphic arts, papermaking and binding, the original machines still functioning and put to work. The College always has a master printer and an apprentice among their fellows. Davies began the 'Library' and he and his father, Senator William Rupert Davies contributed a great number of items for its benefit.



As you may have guessed by now, the Robertson Davies Library contains the files and references of Carl Dair (1912-1967), the Canadian graphic designer and typographer who designed the 'Cartier' typeface that is depicted on the Davies stamp.

Now we have come full circle and perhaps we know a little more about our simple little stamp honouring Robertson Davies. Davies lived until 1995. His wife Brenda died only a few years ago, living to be 95 years old. It was said that she was a tremendous support to him when he ran Massey College and of course she participated in all theatrical adventures they had.

Massey College was the brainchild of Governor General

Davies wrote several highly regarded novels and won many accolades including a large number of honourary degrees and the Stephen Leacock Medal for Humour. If you would like a list of his works, look online or check out your library.

He was writing and publishing right up to his final years. A toast to Robertson Davies who would have turned 100 on August 28th, 2013!
