

Cover Story - Catapult Mail

By Jerry Piotrowski

Before the development of long range aircraft capable of transporting goods between Europe and North America mail had to be carried aboard transatlantic ships.

In 1929 the Norddeutscher Lloyd shipping line developed a novel way to reduce the time it took for transatlantic mail to reach its destination.

Two of their liners, the Bremen and the Europa, were



fitted with Heinkel HE12 seaplanes and catapult equip

This is an extract from a seminar that was scheduled to be presented at the Mississauga show of April 4th.

With the majority of us stuck at home for the foreseeable future, I would like to share several online resources I use for research and recreation.

Let's start with the basics:

GOOGLE

When searching Google, use the

Advanced search—note all the things you can set to refine your search:

https://www.google.ca/advanced_search

There is also Google Book, which is very different from the ordinary Google. Again, use the advanced version:

As then, Canadians today can and will do what we're called to do, even if all that is, is to wash our hands frequently and practice 'social distancing'.

I want to stress that 'social distancing' doesn't

mean you need to do without social interaction - it's just going to be a bit different!

You may or may not have heard, but several internet service providers (Rogers, Telus and Tek Savvy, if I recall correctly) have stated that they will offer unlimited internet during this crisis. (Or, at least until the end of April check with your provider to confirm their offer!)

Take advantage of this to:

- Video call friends and family using Skype or Face Time or a similar app;
- reach out to others through email;
- do some online research. Take a look at Michel Houde's Introduction to Online Research, starting on page 1, for some hints on where to get started; and
- watch those YouTube videos!

Here's a challenge for all of our clubs: Organize an online talk or seminar.

You can use a free service like Zoom. Or post a non-interactive presentation on YouTube. If you think it might become a regular thing, look at other services like GoToMeeting. Some plans start at less than \$20 per month for the host, and you can have up to 250 attendees for free.

Let me know when and where these are, and we'll try to get them on the calendars on the GRVPA website, or mention them in the next issue.

Maybe this is your chance to re-connect with members who can't make it to meetings.

Please note: this isn't an endorsement of any of the services mentioned above; I'm just naming some I've heard of to get you started.

ment. Once the ship was within the aircrafts capabilities from the destination the catapult would launch the aircraft along with its cargo of mail. This typically reduced the time it took for transatlantic mail to reach its destination by about 36 hours.

The service continued to be used during the summers from 1929-1936. The development and use of longer range aircraft made the catapult service obsolete.

Say there is the fantastic website you use, but it has no 'Search' feature. What to do?

Unless the webmaster has blocked Google, a regular google search will find what you are looking for, if it exists, but it might be buried among tens of thousands of results from thousands of websites. Here is how to get only the results for that favourite website:

Go to Advanced Google: https://www.google.ca/advanced_search?hl=en

Let us say that your favourite website's URL is http://www.OnlyFunStamps.com

Copy the URL and paste it in the box labelled "site or domain" on the Advanced Google page. Next, enter your search, say "butterflies" in one of the boxes under "Find pages with..." and click the Advance Search blue button at the bottom of the page.

Good hunting!

Other options include:

ON-LINE DATABASE OF GENUINE STAMPS ISSUED BY UPU COUNTRIES SINCE 2002

This fantastic website maybe just what you have been looking for. Say you collect only BIRD stamps; you can search for all such stamps issued since 2002! Or, say you want to see all the stamps issued in a certain year - you can do that, too!



"Developed by the Universal Postal Union (UPU) and the World Association for the Development of Philately (WADP), the WADP Numbering System (WNS) was introduced on 1 January 2002 with the aim of creating a database of all authentic postage stamps issued by UPU member countries and

territories on or after that date."

For each country is listed by year all the genuine stamps they issue. Each stamp is given a unique WADP number, date issued, the theme and subject, its size, its layout, its perforation, etc. You can also see a large size image of the stamp. In addition, the pages can be viewed in French or English.

There's also <u>Wikipedia</u>, which was launched in 2001 as "... a free online encyclopedia with the aim to allow anyone to edit articles. Wikipedia is the largest and most popular general reference work on the Internet and is owned by the non-profit Wikimedia Foundation. It comprises more than 40 million articles in 299 different languages." < https://en.wikipedia.org >

Despite the criticism of Wikipedia, I have found it useful for names and dates which I can then double check with other sources. Also, most articles of interest to my research list references and have a bibliography.

Tips - Do not assume that articles are translated into English. I have had success searching the French and German Wikimedia sits for articles that do not appear on the English site.
