



Lot 1	Stack of Firby Auction catalogues, Opusculum (stamp stories) Precancel and Revenue Catalogues (First editions)
Lot 2	APS Book "Fundamentals of Philately" by L.N Williams and ATA Handbook 133, Topcial Stamp Collecting
Lot 3	8 page stockbook filled with New Zealand stamps
Lot 4	2 binders of T country stamps. Includes Tanzania, Turks and Caicos, Thailand, Togo, Trinidad & Tobago and more.
Lot 5	2 binders with stamps the Turkey, and the other with stamps from Switzerland. Includes letters plus stamps
Lot 6	3 binders with stamps the Orange River Colony, Wallis and Futuna and R countries including Russia, Rwanda, Reunion, Rhodesia and more
Lot 7	1 binder of stamps from the Vatican City.
Lot 8	2 binders with stamps from S countries, including the Saint Caribbean islands, Samoa, Singapore etc
Lot 9	2 binders with stamps from the Y and Z countries, Yeman, Yugoslavia, Zaire, Zambia, Zimbabwe
Lot 10	2 binders with stamps from Norway and Romania
Lot 11	A small binder filled with Canadian precancels and many RPO's
Lot 12	3 Lighthouse stockbooks, 8 pages each, filled with stamps from Germany, a mixture of periods but most seem modern
Lot 13	2-8 page stockbooks filled with stamps from Great Britain. Many machins in one of the stockbooks
Lot 14	2 binders with stamps from E and F countries including Egypt, Ecuador, Estonia and Falkland Islands, Faroe Islands and Finland
Lot 15	3 binders with stamps from C and D countries including Cyprus, Czechoslovakia, Denmark and Dominican Republic
Lot 16	2 binders with stamps from China, including Taiwan, and Cuba
Lot 17	A Lighthouse 16 page stockbook (white pages) with stamps from Australia. Many many stamps mostly 50's to modern
Lot 18	A 2 inch binder with stamps from Columbia. Sorted onto pages, but also a few stock pages in the front of the binder
Lot 19	A 3 inch binder labelled Canada, from 1991 to present plus back of book. Singles, mini sheets, envelopes and show covers.
Lot 20	A 3 inch binder with stamps from Canada from King George 6 to 1990. Singles, covers blocks pairs etc.
Lot 21	A 3 inch binder filled with postcards showing sailboats, canoe ships bridges maps etc. Most showing scenes from Canada and the US.
Lot 22	A Lindner stockbook (damaged) filled with modern United States. 16 white pages.
Lot 23	2 binders, 3 inches each, of stamps from the United States. Stamps from 1960 to around 2000. Singles, interesting cancels, covers, blocks etc

Lot 2	Binders of topicals and United States stamps. Topicals include "Bridges," "US Flags and States," "United States to 1940," "United States 1941 to 2000" and "United States 2001 to Present"
Lot 3	4 Binders with topicals; "Graphic Arts," "Postal History," "Geography," and "Birds." Not many each binder but a nice start for someone to work on.
Lot 4	3 Binders and a stockbook. 1 binder and a stockbook of Australian stamps, with 2 other binders labelled British commonwealth and "Miscellaneous."
Lot 5	2 binders filled with stamps from "B" countries and another binder of Brazil.
Lot 6	A binder of Belgian stamps from early to modern, including back of book material. Nice start to expand on.
Lot 7	2 binders with stamps from Italy and "J" countries. Includes Jamaica, Jersey, Jordon plus more
Lot 8	2 binders with stamps from Japan and Mexico.
Lot 9	3 binders with stamps from K and L countries, plus a binder of Malaya/Malaysia. K countries include Kenya, Korea and Kuwait and L countries include Labuan, Luxemburg, Latvia, and Liechtenstein. Plus more countries
Lot 10	Owen Sound Stamp Club golf shirt (XL) and an Owen Sound Stamp Club carrying bag
Lot 11	2 binders, one with I countries and a small binder with mint Italy. I countries include Iceland, Ifni, India including some Azadhind WW2 independence movement, Indonesia, Iran and Isle of Man
Lot 12	2 binders, one of Ireland and the other of Israel.
Lot 13	A 3 inch binder filled with Hungary, many many stamps.
Lot 14	2 1.5 inch binders of stamps from Hong Kong (1 binder) and H countries including Hong Kong, Hungary, Haiti and Honduras

Lot 16	3 binders from Germany. A 3 inch binder with German States, West Germany, semi postal etc, a binder of GDR and a binder of Berlin (each 1 inch thick)

November Meeting Highlights






The meeting started with a moment of silence in member of Al Roos, who had passed away on November 17th, a few days before the meeting was held. The previous newsletter editor, Marion Ace, did a story of Al in the newsletter several (maybe many) years ago. The article follows.

Who's Who...

Let me introduce you to Al Roos. He's the guy who is always ever so quietly bidding against me in the auctions. I've had a couple of chats with Al Roos

lately. Al helped out at the information session at the mall in mid October. He told me that he would like to see more kids involved in stamp collecting. It was easy to see his pleasure when some enthusiastic children were picking through the giant stamp box. When traffic slowed down a little, we had a chance to reminisce for a while.



Al was born in Timmins and farmed for a number of years in Mossley, east of London, Ontario. Then for a complete change of pace, he taught in Madoc for a year and then came to Owen Sound where he taught at the West Hill High School for seventeen years.

Al worked with mentally challenged kids and kids who needed help with the basics in life. He started out teaching woodworking and went on to teach everything from art to English. He had a good chuckle telling me how he worked with the girls teaching them how to wait on tables. I imagine that Al's years teaching held many triumphs and some disappointments, but I'll bet he was never bored!

Al Roos collects mainly Canadian stamps and has a world wide collection as well. He got his first stamp album when he was seven. Apparently his Scandinavian collection is pretty good. Al's Mother came from Denmark and his Dad came from Sweden, so Al had a great source of stamps from his family's correspondence. His Mom was also very supportive by purchasing mint Canadian stamps for him.

Retired for twenty years now, besides stamp collecting Al likes to paint with watercolours. He went to courses for years and when they were discontinued, him and some of his classmates carried on and formed their own 'Group of Seven'. They paint on Mondays at the Westside United Church. In the past Al has shown his watercolours at the Sauble and Warton Arts & Craft Shows. This past summer his landscape and flower paintings were displayed at the Lion's Head Art

Show. We'll have to find out where his next show is; I for one would love to see his work!
