Xmas

I enjoy etymology, the study, you might say, of a word's history.

When you first saw the word 'Xmas", you may have thought, as many have, that this was just a device to remove Christ from Christmas for some reason. This is not the case.

This particular 'X' is actually the Greek letter 'chi' and is the first letter of the Greek word for Christ, 'KHRISTOS'. Xmas is still pronounced the same as its longer cousin.

According to the *Online Etymology Dictionary*, the roots of Xmas can be traced back as far as the 12th century: ""Christmas," 1551, X'temmas, wherein the X is an abbreviation for Christ in Christmas, from first letter of Gk. Christos "Christ".

In this set are Raoul Jobin with the Palais Garnier of Paris, Maureen Forrester with the Place des Arts of Montreal, Jon Vickers with La Scala of Milan, Edward Johnson with the Metropolitan Opera of New York, and the married duo of Leopold Simoneau and Pierrette Alarie with the Opéra-Comique of France.
